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miart 2020: sympathy between things

In 1981, Luciano Fabro wrote that "our experience is an exploration of the sympathy between things." He was describing the process by which an artist deploys materials, develops space and explores relationship dynamics. The combination of two materials or colours, for example, no longer generated "a sense of union, but a sense of a third thing."

Fabro lived, worked and taught in Milan and his words allow us to comprehend the profound transformative power of art which, by establishing relationships between different things, can open up new worlds and create a broader experience.

By exploring the relationships and interactions between past and present, between the traditional and the experimental, miart has forged its own style and identity. It is based on the belief that different eras – and the work of the artists that come to define them – do not exist in a state of autonomy, but rather play a role in helping to understand each other. Because things, like people, exist together.

The 2020 edition of the fair will integrate modern and contemporary art with architecture, design and applied arts. Given that miart is designed to provide a forum for dialogue, this move is indicative of a desire to share with our audience spontaneous and intuitive forms of "sympathy between things".

Milan

Milan, 21 January 2020 – miart, the international modern and contemporary art fair organised by Fiera Milano, is set to return for its 25th edition between 17 and 19 April 2020. The event will be under the artistic directorship of Alessandro Rabottini for the fourth consecutive year and will be sponsored by Intesa Sanpaolo as the main partner.

183 galleries from **20 countries** will display works by modern masters, contemporary established artists, emerging talents, and renowned and experimental designers.

miart 2020 is divided into five sections, providing a forum for dialogue between modern art, contemporary art and collectable design:

- **Established Contemporary**: international contemporary art and limitededition design from 2000 to the present day.
- **Established Masters**: modern art and design from 1900 to 1999, with a particular focus on the masters of post-war Italian art and figures that have been subject to a recent rediscovery in terms of art criticism and the market.
- **Generations**: dialogues between two artists/architects/designers from different generations, based on formal and conceptual affinities.
- **Decades**: nine monographic or themed booths exploring the history of the 20th century, decade by decade.
- **Emergent**: galleries working to promote the newest generations

The concept behind the fair is inspired by Milan's cultural DNA and its distinctive blend of tradition and experimentation. Historically, in Milan innovative design and architecture have always enjoyed a close relationship with the avant-garde art world, nurturing a productive dialogue between the different disciplines. In support of this vision, for the first time the fair layout will be designed to bring art galleries next to design and decorative arts galleries.

miart 2020 will welcome a number of prestigious international galleries who have chosen Milan for the first time or who are returning after a period of





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absence, such as **A Gentil Carioca** (Rio de Janeiro), **Blank** (Cape Town), **Rossella Colombari** (Milan), **Chantal Crousel** (Paris), **Gagosian** (New York – Los Angeles – San Francisco – London – Paris – Geneva – Basel – Rome – Athens – Hong Kong), **Jackson Design** (Stockholm), **Karsten Greve** (St. Moritz – Paris – Cologne), **Kadel Willborn** (Düsseldorf), **Nilufar** (Milan), **Franco Noero** (Turin), **Eva Presenhuber** (Zurich – New York), and **Thomas Schulte** (Berlin) amongst others.

A large number of influential galleries will return to miart having already taken part in previous editions, such as A Arte Invernizzi (Milan), Alfonso Artiaco (Naples), Isabella Bortolozzi (Berlin), Cabinet (London), Campoli Presti (London – Paris), ChertLüdde (Berlin), Clearing (Brussels – New York – Brooklyn), Galleria Continua (San Gimignano – Beijing – Les Moulins – Habana – Rome), Raffaella Cortese (Milan), Corvi-Mora (London), Dvir Gallery (Brussels – Tel Aviv), Galleri Felt (Copenhagen), Gladstone Gallery (New York – Brussels), Marian Goodman Gallery (New York – Paris – London), Herald St (London), Kaufmann Repetto (Milan – New York), Peter Kilchmann (Zurich), Andrew Kreps Gallery (New York), Lelong & Co (Paris – New York), Magazzino (Rome), Massimo Minini (Brescia), P420 (Bologna), Lia Rumma (Milan – Naples), Sprovieri (London) Vistamare (Pescara – Milan), Hubert Winter (Vienna), and Zero (Milan).

miart 2020 will have a strong emphasis on **art of the last century**, as shown by the wide range of participating galleries active in this field, including **Cardi** (Milan – London), **Cortesi** (Lugano – London – Milan), **Galleria dello Scudo** (Verona), **Galleria d'Arte Maggiore G.A.M.** (Bologna – Paris – Milan), **Giò Marconi** (Milan), **Mazzoleni** (London – Turin), **Montrasio Arte** (Monza – Milan), **Repetto Gallery** (London), **Robilant + Voena** (London – Milan – St. Moritz), **Gian Enzo Sperone** (Sent – New York) and **Tornabuoni Arte** (Firenze – Milano – Parigi – Londra).

One of the focus areas for miart is on the work of Italian artists that had been consigned to history but that in recent years have become the subject of international attention - both in art circles and on the market. Such artists include Arturo Martini, Fabio Mauri, Marisa Merz, Anselmo, Afro, Piero Manzoni and Maria Lai. miart has also worked to recontextualise exponents of the Italian post-war period in relation to international contemporary artists, as is the case for the Generations section, which pairs Giorgio Morandi with Paloma Varga





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Weisz, Nick Mauss with Gastone Novelli, Sterling Ruby with Alberto Burri and Matt Connors with Piero Dorazio.

The newly devised **Curatorial Advisory Circle** will support an inclusive and multidisciplinary approach to miart 2020. Five international curators active in Europe, North America, and Africa are the members of the Circle: **João Laia** (Chief Curator, Kiasma - National Museum of Contemporary Art, Helsinki), **Steven Learner** (Creative Director, Collective Design, New York), **Nana Oforiatta Ayim** (Founder, ANO Institute of Arts and Knowledge, Accra and Curator of Ghana Pavillion at the last Venice Biennale), **Florence Ostende** (Curator, Barbican Art Gallery, London), **Fabian Schöneich** (Curator and Writer, Berlin). Their experience will implement the vision of the miart curatorial team, comprised of **Alberto Salvadori** (Director, ICA, Milan), curator of the *Established Masters* and *Decades* sections, **Oda Albera**, Coordinator of the Special Projects, and **Attilia Fattori Franchini** (Independent Curator, London - Vienna), curator of the *Emergent* section.

Over **60** international museum directors and curators will take part in an ambitious schedule of talks and will sit on the various panels responsible for awarding a wide array of prizes.

The directors and curators of 18 international museums and prestigious institutions from 10 countries will form part of the panels tasked with assigning the Fiera Milano Acquisition Fund and the five awards that miart has created for art galleries and artists:

- Fondazione Fiera Milano Purchasing Fund.
- The **Herno Prize** for the best exhibition project.
- **Fidenza Village Prize for** *Generations* for the best dialogue project in the section.
 - LCA Prize for Emergent for the best presentation in the section.

The **On Demand Prize by Snaporazverein**, now in its fourth edition, will be assigned to an artist whose work will be shown at miart 2020 and whose practice includes performative elements. The winning artist will be given the chance to conceive a new production that will be staged at the **Triennale Milano Teatro** on the occasion of the **2021 edition** of the **Milano Art Week**, after a residency at the newly opened **Casa degli Artisti**.







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The **INNSiDE Prize** - developed in collaboration with the Hotel INNSiDE By Melia Milano Torre GalFa – will, for the very first time, be awarded to the gallery which presents the best solo or two person exhibition during the 2020 edition, with a particular focus on social inclusion, environmental sustainability, and global change.

For the fifth consecutive year, the miartalks will be organised in partnership with the production company In Between Art film. The initiative will encompass three days of public talks, with previous editions featuring over 160 international speakers, including Paola Antonelli, Christian Marclay, Vivien M. Greene, Jessica Morgan, Chris Dercon, Elmgreen & Dragset, Massimiliano Gioni, Kasper König, Deyan Sudjic, Nancy Olnick and Giorgio Spanu, Alice Rawsthorn, Tony Chambers, Walid Raad, Zoë Ryan, Michael Anastassiades, Jeremy Deller, Stephanie Rosenthal, Hans Ulrich Obrist among others.

The 2020 program will involve **40 international artists, curators, collectors, designers, museum directors** and **thinkers** around the theme of "The Existence of the Artist".

As one of miart's consolidated traditions, the interiors of both the **VIP lounge** and the three-star Michelin restaurant Da Vittorio have been conceived in partnership with **Elle Decor** and will present a signature light installation by acclaimed London-based Cypriot designer **Michael Anastassiades**. Taking centre stage of the project will be a site-specific arrangement of Anastassiades' **Mobile Chandeliers Collection** (2008-2019), first presented as a whole in the context of his retrospective "Things That Go Together" at NiMAC, Nicosia, 2019.

miart's educational efforts will continue through **miarteducational**, free guided tours made possible thanks to the support of **Fidenza Village and Value Retail**.

As per tradition, miart will become the epicentre of **Milan Art Week**, a rich programme of exhibition openings and events organised in collaboration with the **Municipality of Milan** and that involve the **major public institutions** and **private foundations** of Milan.

Since the launch of the 2016 edition, miartalks have been made possible thanks to the support of **In Between Art Film**, the film production company founded by **Beatrice Bulgari** in 2012 to encourage the exchange between different contemporary art forms by producing art films and documentaries and supporting institutional projects linked to the world of the moving image. More recently, INBAF supported the film programmes of **Tate Modern** in London, the **MAXXI** in Rome, **Documenta** in Kassel, together with co-producing **Shirin Neshat**'s feature film *Looking for Oum Kulthum*, and supported both the **Biennale de l'Image en Mouvement** in Geneva and **Manifesta 12** in Palermo.

On 17, 18 and 19 April, over **40 artists, curators, museum directors, collectors, designers** and **international thought-leaders** will come together to discuss the theme of the talks, "**The Existence of the Artist**". The complete programme of panels will be announced at the end of March 2020.

At fairs and in museums, galleries and Biennals, artists are present through their works: their thoughts and feelings are manifested through formal, physical and conceptual outputs.

The new cycle of miartalks will shift the attention upon the "here and now" of the existence of artists as individuals, focusing on their presence in the factual space and time of their lives.

The miartalks will pose a number of questions:

What are the thought processes that artists active far behind their formal creations?

What impact do the relationships artists engage in have on the reality around them?

Who inherits their "voice" when they are gone and only their work and their writing remains to convey their thoughts? What kind of space are artists able to carve out for themselves between immersing themselves in society and isolating themselves creatively?







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So far, miart talks has brought over 160 international speakers to Milan, including Kasper König, Jessica Morgan, Deyan Sudjic, Massimiliano Gioni, Chris Dercon, Jeremy Deller, Walid Raad, Paola Antonelli, Christian Marclay, Adriano Pedrosa, Ralph Rugoff, Stefan Kalmár, Jérôme Bel, Beatriz Colomina, Elmgreen & Dragset, Ippolito Pestellini Laparelli, Alice Rawsthorn, Michael Anastassiades, Zoë Ryan, Suzanne Cotter, Nancy Olnick e Giorgio Spanu, Francesco Manacorda, Stephanie Rosenthal, Anri Sala, Annie Fletcher, Martin Bethenod, Hans Ulrich Obrist, Michelangelo Pistoletto, Lauren Cornell, Ahmet Öğüt, Vivien Greene, Nicolaus Schafhausen, and Aric Chen among the many others.

The 2020 programme is curated by **Alberto Salvadori** (Director, ICA, Milan) and **Mirjam Varadinis** (Curator, Kunsthaus, Zurich).





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miart 2020 TRANSMISSION

Transmission is the new visual campaign developed to advertise the 25th edition of the International Modern and Contemporary Art Fair of Milan.

For each edition, miart commissions a creative campaign that expands and articulates a new concept, exploring every time a different aspect of our relationship with creativity and art. *Transmission* is a story that investigates the space in which human beings and works of art come into contact through expressions of care and protection.

The campaign is a journey through the meaning of study and forms of understanding, in which the main subjects are professionals whose daily work involves them intimately with artworks, including museums keepers, restorers, and art handlers. *Transmission* evokes their responsibility to the present and future, and the importance of an attentive handling of the past so that art and culture can be conserved and made accessible now and in the future. The campaign is a choreography of situations in which human beings, objects, science, and technology live a relationship of interdependence. The centre of the campaign is art as the site of an experience that embodies both the fragility of memory and the persistence of life.

Transmission also sets a unique precedent in the history of miart: a fruitful collaboration with important Milanese institutions, whose collections and work go beyond the chronological boundaries of miart itself, and who boast an exceptional commitment to the conservation of art. miart and Fiera Milano are grateful to Gallerie d'Italia, GAM - Galleria d'Arte Moderna, Museo Poldi Pezzoli, Veneranda Fabbrica del Duomo di Milano and The Department of Conservation and Restoration of Open Care - FM Centre for Contemporary Art for their unstinting collaboration and support.

Launched last October, *Transmission* will convey the many narratives of miart: the dialogue between the past and present, history, experimentation and the interdisciplinary approach to the co-existence of modern art, contemporary art, design and applied arts.





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MILANO ARTWEEK 2020

From 14th till 19th April 2020, during miart, the international modern and contemporary art fair, Milan becomes a hub for visual culture and modern and contemporary art, thanks to the exciting calendar of events of *Milano ArtWeek*, which chalks up its fourth edition in 2020.

Promoted by the City of Milan in collaboration with miart, *Milano Art Week* sees the participation of the major public institutions and the most prestigious private foundations, all proactive in inaugurating new exhibitions and original artistic commissions.

The 2020 programme confirms Milan's thriving exhibition scene, which makes it an **ideal international destination for art lovers and sector professionals**, and reflects the diverse range of institutions and venues that form the city's cultural mosaic: museums, art centres, private foundations and design spaces offer the public the fruits of a shared commitment through **solo and collective exhibitions, performances and talks**.

The 30 projects presented today, illustrated in the attached info files, whet the appetite in anticipation of the calendar set to be unveiled in its entirety in Milan in March 2020.

Important international artists will be the focus of solo exhibitions and new commissions: Olafur Eliasson for Fondazione Nicola Trussardi, Tania Bruguera at the PAC|Padiglione d'Arte Contemporanea contemporary art gallery, Martin Kippenberger and Liu Ye at Fondazione Prada, Rirkrit Tiravanija and Daniele Puppi at the Museum of Science and Technology, Akram Zaatari at FM Centre for Contemporary Art, Charles Atlas at ICA Milan, Enzo Mari and Hans Ulrich Obrist at the Triennale Milano, Trisha Baga at the Pirelli HangarBicocca, Franco Guerzoni at Museo del Novecento, Marinella Senatore at Fondazione Stelline and Alessandro Pessoli at the Diocesan Museum.

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Major retrospectives and in-depth exhibitions will be devoted to complex historical figures including **Chen Zhen** at the Pirelli HangarBicocca, **Carla Accardi** at the Museo del Novecento **Carol Rama** and **Co Westerik** at Fondazione Carriero, and **Gianni Colombo** at Fondazione Marconi, while at the Triennale **Guillermo Kuitca** will curate a selection of works from the collection of **Fondation Cartier pour l'Art Contemporain**.

The language of performance art, meanwhile, will be explored by **Christodoulos Panayiotou** at the Triennale Milano Teatro and **MAI/Marina Abramović Institute** at the Fondazione Giangiacomo Feltrinelli.





The public art project *ArtLine Milano*, the Parco delle Sculture sculpture park in the Citylife district – which already showcases design by renowned architects Isozaki, Hadid and Libeskind e Fuksas – will be boosted by four new *site-specific* works created by **Mario Airò**, **Alfredo Jaar**, **Maurizio Nannucci**, **Wilfredo Prieto**.

The programme clearly reveals the fabric of the important alliance between the public and private sectors that Milan has woven, thread by thread, over the years, involving institutions and sector operators, curators and international artists in planning the city's cultural life.
